

A message from Heirloom Editor David Nelson:



The fund to put a fitting memorial on the grave of Kurt Kriszhaber, whose family perished in the Holocaust, and who himself died in a tragic accident in 1946, has now reached \$1735.

We are a third of the way there - the target is \$5000 which will pay for the memorial, an inscription, foundations and cemetery fees.

Permission has been granted to place the memorial but to reach the target I still need your help.

Response to my recent presentation at the Society engendered \$80 cash almost immediately in donations from just three people. We have over 220 members – if everyone gave just \$15 the memorial would be paid for.


“Anyone who lived through the Holocaust deserves a proper burial and headstone. I wish my grandparents had a grave to place a headstone.”
